

## YOUR TOTAL JOINT REPLACEMENT

#### **PRIOR TO SURGERY**

# • Preparing For Surgery

- You will require a home caretaker for the majority of the day and night during the first week after surgery. Please make sure you prepare accordingly.
- You may want to stock up on packaged foods or make extra meals that you can freeze for later.
- Getting your home ready so it will be easy to get around when you're less mobile is important.
- You may need to set up a temporary bedroom on the first floor if you have a multi-level home. This, however, is not necessary for most.
- You may also want to clear your hallways so you can navigate them with a walker.

## Pre-Admission Testing & Physical Exam

- o Please bring a list of your current medications to this appointment.
- My staff will schedule your pre-admission testing and total joint class at Bon Secours. Parham will call you to schedule this date and time.
- You can contact Bon Secours central scheduling directly at (804) 627-5620[St. Francis] or (804) 747-5617 [Parham] if you need to reschedule or change these dates.
- They will make every effort to schedule this on the same day, however, dates are controlled by the hospital.
- These dates should be listed on your "important dates" sheet provided in this packet to fill in.
- You will report to the registration desk at the hospital for your appointment and check-in.
- You must also have a physical exam prior to your surgery; typically, this is done during your pre-admission testing appointment.
  - Alternatively, this may be done by your primary care provider.
  - All labs should be done at the hospital. There are certain labs, such as a MRSA screen and Type & Cross which can only be done at the hospital.

#### Total Joint Class

- The class is very informative and can provide answers to many basic questions regarding total joint replacement before, during, and after hospitalization.
- The date for your total joint class will also be listed on your "important dates" sheet in this packet.

- Please have your caretaker who will be with you following surgery attend the class as well.
- This class is mandatory prior to your surgery.
- o They will discuss what to bring and where to go on the day of your surgery.

## Medical Clearance

- o Primary care clearance is required prior to surgery.
- If you see a specialist (Cardiology, Nephrology, etc), you may be required to obtain additional clearance.
